This isn't the best installment in the How Do Dinosaurs series. It seems a little gimmicky in every way: it's a different size and format, it's a pretty random premise, it features scratch-and-sniff cookie spots (which didn't smell like a thing, but that's probably because we checked it out from the library), and it has recipes in the back. Mostly it seemed odd that the artwork was almost completely recycled from previous books in the series, but with cookie-related props thrown in. It wasn't terrible, it just didn't really hit the mark.

How do Dinosaurs Eat cookies? Is a very creative book, that starts off with each page explaining what a student might think when a dinosaur makes or eats cookies. As adults we can imagine these dinosaur's behaviors as their children's very own. When children read this book, they are able to make connections with it if they've ever made cookies before. If not, they can relate to just eating the delicious finished product. After reading as a class I would apply this in my classroom by using the rhyming words that we find in the book. We could also use this as a way for students to spend journal time writing about how they act when they help their parents make cookies or what they learned about rhyming by making something of their own. Using books that children can relate to, will keep them engaged and this is one of those books they can have a connection with.
