There are so many betrayals and complicated plans and half thought out beliefs running around in Exiled Queen, I was just glad when it was over. It can be done well - the betrayals and complicated plans that is. The author just needs to actually put the words in to make it more than afterthought so I care.

We see a lot of Ivy Lane in this book. Again, I don't believe it is necessary to read the Changeling Chronicles series prior to these books, but it would probably help.

The characters, once again, just kind of end up where they're supposed to be, doing what they're supposed to be doing, and everything is okay in the end. They're still the same people they were when the series started, yet they think they're better now that they went through these trials. Raine has the boyfriend, and the powers,

and the security inherent in those at the end. This isn't going to be a surprise to anyone.

Being bound by vow to Aspen complicates her life, her dad disappeared somewhere in Faerie, the summer court is dead set on punishing her for Lady Hornbeam's death, the mortal realm is no longer a safe haven for her, and on top of her, the mastermind schemes her dear mother composes in her head launched a very intense and very lethal faerie game. Raine must use all her wits and all help she could get, taking advantage of her magic and her connection to Cedar, to even stand a chance against Lady Whitefall.

I truly enjoyed every single book in this series, each one more than the previous one. This one was like a tornado, unpredictable, stormy, brutal, never ceasing in action and tension, and with emotions twirling back and forth in wide range and high intensity. I simply could not get enough and glued my eyes on the pages until there was nothing left for me to read.

Raine and Cedar are an interesting couple full of surprises. Compatible in more than one way, they have to uncover their mutual feelings and magical compatibility in order to fully understand what it means for them to work as a team, to be as one. And with each new piece of information, with every new discovery, I got excited more and more, hoping they would stick together until the end and relying on the human part of their half-blood nature to act less coldly than the pure-blooded Sidhe. They both changed noticeably over the course of the whole story, but naturally so, considering Raine had to adjust to the dangerous life in Faerie, and Cedar had to step out of his master's shadow and explore his own magic.
