When I read romance books there are several things that really make me enjoy the book, they are: clean, good chemistry between the main characters, believable dialogue, and good characters.

For Love or Money was book 2 of the Main Street Merchants series by Paige Timothy. It is a novella, about 100 pages in length. It is about Morgan (roommate to Laurie the main character from book 1) and her journey in discovering love. Does she go for the hot new guy in town? Or does she discover she has feelings for best friend/co-worker Rory?

I have mixed feelings about this book. I really wish that this book did not overlap the same timing as book 1. It made me wish I hadn't read the first book first because it gave things away with this book and so I didn't care as much or get excited about scenes that she was trying to develop. I felt it was a waste of pages to repeat scenes from book one almost word for word, especially since it was a novella. When I was reading I was almost wishing that she had combined book 1 and 2 and made it into a full-length book or two. I know novellas are supposed to be quick and short and sweet, but I guess I liked the characters so much I didn't want them to be in novella format.

That being said I really liked Morgan and Rory. I'm glad that there was drama and growth with the characters, but the drama wasn't drawn out. I enjoyed the side characters and hope that they are in future books in this series.

This book contained all the elements I like in a romance, but because it bothered me that there were two repeated scenes from the first book I can't say that I love it.

So I am giving it 4 out of 5 stars.

I have not yet read book one in the Main Street Merchants series (although I will definitely be grabbing an ecopy soon to read), so I did not have any fore knowledge of characters in the series. I did not feel at all hampered by this, the story felt completely readable, independent from the series.

I love clean romances and this one is a definite winner. Having read the 1st book of the series and found it outstanding I decided to try the 2nd of the series. Once again I found a fast paced, page turning, story with true to life characters and a believable story line. I found the way Ms. Timothy's approach to the series somewhat unique. Many series use the linear approach where book 2 picks up where book 1 leaves off. Not so with book 2 of this series. Instead she takes a parallel approach. Book 2 starts at the same time as book one with mostly the same cast of characters – only with different protagonists. In fact, there are several dialogue passages that are identical to book 1 because both heroines are in the same scene in book 1 and 2. This is both unique and effective. Other than having her protagonists walking down the wrong side of the street at one point, I could not find a single inconsistency. Great story! Five Stars!
