Cute story, and a really quick read. While I enjoyed this story, it wasn't up to the standards established by its predecessors. The character development of Alonia and Trift was very topical, aligning with their personalities. It seemed that Kellen's character matured the most in this installation and was the focal point, not Alonia and Trift. There were also a lot of questions about Trift that were unanswered, like how old he was, when did he leave the village, and why don't the girls remember him? It seemed like everyone in the village knew Trift except for the girls. Also, how big is he? The book cover image makes it seem that Trift is a small dragon, but if he was that small why would Alonia need to move?

At times, the dialog was confusing. I am not sure if it is a Kindle nuance, but some of the dialogs ran together so you couldn't discern exactly who was speaking.

I also noticed in this story (it might have happened in prior stories and I didn't notice before), that Irin is called "old man" a lot by a several different people. This only stands out because the authors write that only one person could say that, but it seemed like everyone (dragon and elf) was calling him that without any repercussions.
