Bought this one as a random bi-menage buy on the All Romance Ebooks website. I'd read a few other books by the author so I figured I'd probably like it. It was a fairly decent book, though not really great.

Series Note:

Summary:

Growing up with a slut mother, Randi Jenkins was always the subject of gossip. Even if she, herself, had done nothing to earn it. Then she finds her boyfriend cheating on her and goes a little crazy, sending the gossips running. Randi is horrified. But things get even more complicated when a long-time crush, and supposedly gay friend takes her home and he and his lover confess that they've wanted Randi for a long time. Randi gives in that night, but realizes what she'd be setting herself up for if she stayed with them as they wanted. The gossips would really have something to talk about then! So she high tails it out of town.

A few years pass before Jon Denton and Wyatt Morgan finally decide to go after Randi. It's obvious when they confront her that the chemistry is still there, but Randi is still extremely wary of public opinion and keeps shooting them down. It isn't until tragedy strikes that Randi begins to realize that it doesn't matter what other people think.

Review:

The summary of this book is just a little misleading. It gives you the impression that Randi finds her boyfriend cheating and decides to say screw what people think and goes after what she really wants. It doesn't quite go like that. Randi fights her feelings for Wyatt and Jon for pretty much the entire book because she is so afraid of what people think. I was a bit disappointed in that because I thought this would be a book with a stronger heroine who took charge and got what she wanted, public opinion be damned. Initially I liked that she was concerned about drawing attention because of the possibility of getting involved in an unconventional relationship. Because that's realistic. But then I got annoyed as the book went on and it went a bit overboard with Randi's obsessive avoidance of doing anything to draw attention to herself and over-worrying what people think of her. She lets things happen to her that she shouldn't solely because she doesn't want to be talked about. I wanted to tell her to grow a pair.

The characters were pretty good. I mostly liked all three of them. And there's a nice amount of emotional development during the story. I did wish there was a bit more about Wyatt and Jon's past...more about how they met, how they got involved, their sexuality, and all that. I was left wondering a few things about them.

I think the one thing I disliked most about the book, though, was that the relationship between Jon and Wyatt, which existed for quite a while prior to the point this story starts, became too dependent upon Randi's involvement. It really took something away from their relationship when their relationship suffered because she wasn't there. It was an injustice to what they had together. And I also wish there had been more scenes focusing just on the relationship between Jon and Wyatt.

But even though there were things about the book that bugged me, I still mostly liked it. It was better than some bi-menage books that I've read.

It turns out the entire town knew about her cheating bf, but instead of telling her, they gossiped behind her back. To make matters worse, her two biggest crushes, childhood friend Wyatt and his lover Jon, also knew all about it. Jon being the small town's Sheriff just got a front row seat to her meltdown.

Jon has had a crush on Randi Lee from the first time he met her, and Wyatt since they were in school together. He and Wyatt have waited a long time to bring her into their lifestyle. Now that she's single, Jon can't hold off any longer. Together, Jon and Wyatt talk her into their bed. Randi Lee's fantasy finally came true, but the morning after casts a harsh light on reality – they want her, a family, children. That's unthinkable in a small town full of gossipers and small-mindedness. She can't and won't let herself become the center of attention or humiliation ever again. What does she do? She runs.

Fast forward two years later. Randi finally finished nursing school and works in a bigger city. She hasn't forgotten Jon or Wyatt or their night that rocked her world, but she won't go back. Jon and Wyatt haven't fared much better in the past two years, but they still want her. Time has only made their small town even more intolerant of their lifestyle, so after a little sleuthing, they find out where Randi Lee. It's time for a change of location and to get their woman back. That may prove more difficult than they first thought.

I loved Wyatt and Jon. The description of their love for each other was raw, passionate and heart-felt; enough to make hetero couples envious. Randi disappointed me the most in this story. Her waffling and giving gossipers so much power over her life made her unlikeable, at least to me. She runs from them at least four times in this very short story that I almost wanted Jon and Wyatt to just let her go and concentrate on themselves. In the end, she has her little epiphany and all's well that ends well.

Wyatt grew up with Randi Lee and knows all about the skeletons hiding in her closet. Openly having a gay relationship in the afore mentioned small minded town is only possible (comfort wise) due to the fact that his momma is more than willing to put the smack down and tell all the tales about anyone who decides to snub her son and his partner. He realizes that Randi Lee doesn't have that luxury and while he and Jon want her desperately, he understands that her need to keep tongues from wagging is a conditioned response.

The writing duo that is Violet Summers has beautifully penned a realistic novel of love, lust, forgiveness and redemption. There were no easy answers in this book, the characters didn't fall in love and automatically live a fairy tale ending. These three worked for their relationship and made the conscious, informed decision to ignore the outside worlds opinion of them. This book will definitely leave you with Something To Talk About.
