Nice references to Pittsburgh but the abbreviation of "Mog" Monongahel seemed too "I belong to this area "- which Hailey really didn't and my acquaintances from the Pittsburgh area have never used that abbreviation in conversation.

But--

Tone of book feels awkward---1--I kept waiting for the "me too" moment.

2--she's working in one company, falling in lust/love with the head of that company and dating the enemy of the company's head who runs the same type of business--most of this was just stated, integral to story but glossed over. ( pg 18 Peter was sleeping with his wife.--was the affair manipulation by Julie or an affair,)

More detail about the past and not resolving the issue between the two men off scene and the reader just hearing about it would have helped the book

The fact that Maggie was the culprit is again--shown off scene and seemed like a quick fix.

Asking her to come back to work for the company before he tells her he loves her and wants to marry her--bad timing. Is it based on lust or love? And not a good sign for a communicative marriage.

More information about her background, the hobby of kite making, reason for where she lived, why she didn't drive in the city. Again reality of transit in Pittsburg --there are still more cars than convenient transit.

Inconsistences--

1 --she wears an apron when cleaning his Kitchen but didn't in her own kitchen?

2 --an apple for lunch when she's just had a teeth cleaning.?

The whole idea of dating a major competitor of your company is fraught with potential danger/suspicion but the book follows the 50's secretary falling in love with boss formula with the heroine not seeing any pitfalls.

Perspective of book was 3rd person omnipotent with Haley's point of view. (we only see/hear what she is experiencing/told. I wish she'd been told more details.
