We learn more about the Star Lights and their princess Kakyu as they decide to travel to Sagitarius Zero, AKA the Center of all universes. This decision comes about when Bunny discovers the Outer Senshi have been turned to dust and she witnesses Artemis and Luna (revealed to be aliens!!) obliterated. This affects the 30th Century as Diana ceases to exist. Rini is prompted to go back in time to help save her family, this time she'll be accompanied by her own Sailor Scouts, the Amazoness Quartet!

Where the volume was of course enjoyable, it was disappointing as there's only one final volume after this! I wanted to learn more about Chibi Chibi...who is she? And how is she able to achieve the Eternal Scout transformation so young?? Does she have a real name?
