Not having read the first title in this series, I felt quite disoriented during the first 50 pages of the book, the second title in a trilogy. There were too many characters being introduced who may or may not have appeared in the first book--Saffi, a young girl in the clutches of a vampire; a nameless vampire brought back to life by the blood of a mortally wounded rat; Alex Fish, a superior field agent; Woody, a Wolven; his best friend Nat. Then, too, the fact that Woody and Nat Carver are traveling with a circus of very unusual animals added to the confusion. I quickly realized that Nat has Wolven blood too, and those around him are simply waiting to see if/when he will change. In *Wolfling 1* zijn Nat en zijn beste vriend Woody, een wolfling, met moeite uit de klauwen van de slechte weerwolf Lucas Scale ontsnapt. Wat in *Wolfling 2* gelijk opvalt, is dat Nat geen kind meer is. Door de gebeurtenissen in het eerste deel is hij getekend, zowel fysiek – de littekens waar Scale zijn keel heeft opengereten – als mentaal. Er is niets kinderachtigs meer aan hem. En ondertussen verandert hij ook nog eens door het wolflingenbloed. Zijn zicht wordt scherper, zijn gehoor beter en de beheersing over zijn speekselklieren juist slechter. Hij probeert dit voor zijn moeder te verbergen, uit angst dat ze zich anders zorgen zal maken. Gelukkig is hij niet altijd zo serieus bezig. Zijn humor heeft hij nog steeds. Zo kan hij bij het horen over een lokaal gerecht gelijk bang vragen of daar bonen inzitten. In zijn caravan zit namelijk maar een klein raampje en Woody's scheten zijn aardig vergassend. En welke jongen kan zich op dat vlak nou niet in Nat inleven?
