Nate McMann has chosen a solitary life, and he keeps telling himself that he likes it that way. He has a ranch to run, and he also works as a tour guide for a local agency. However, when his former sweetheart, Bethany Marlow, moves back to their home town of Treasure Creek, Alaska, Nate's heart begins to beat a little faster. Make that a whole lot faster! Ten long years ago, Nate had turned away from Bethany, telling her he didn't love her and putting an end to their relationship. He never told her that he had learned he was unable to father children, and since she had stated her reservations about adoption, Nate felt he could provide for her the family life she wanted. Hurt and disillusioned, Bethany left town and made a new life and career for herself as a successful wedding planner. She returns to Treasure Creek to open a wedding shop, and as soon as she meets Nate again, the sparks and hurts come back to haunt them both.
