It reminded me why I love paranormal romance (especially the fanged variety) so much. And it didn't hurt that Alina Popescu sprinkled enough references to World of Warcraft throughout to make my little MMO gaming heart flutter.

Alina has a very interesting approach in how she blends her story. It has elements of fantasy tucked between the romance and vampires. At first, I was afraid the attempt was going to fall flat. But no, I was proved so very wrong. It creates an interesting story. There are also several mentions to pop culture in the book that had the fangirl in me squeeing.

The main character, Alexa, has a strained history with men. Her ex tossed her away for her best friend. My main gripe with this story stems from that. I wasn't able to fathom Alexa willingly putting herself in a relationship so soon after her heartbreak. She didn't come off as the type that jumped from relationship to relationship, loving the idea of love instead of the person she was with. This story is about Alexa, who is currently trying to write a book about vampires. In the meantime, she has been promoting her book through various channels. The lines often blur between what's made up and what's real, what we believe and what we have been led to believe. She meets Anthony, who appears to be interested in her upcoming book. He wines and dines her a bit but turns out to be a bit more than he claimed – a not very nice vampire. Through Anthony, Alexa meets Louis, a much nicer vampire, whom she actually falls for.

Louis is a much older vampire with greater powers that he keeps somewhat hidden from the rest of vamp society. He teams up with Alexa to find the truth behind the kidnappings and deaths of important older vamps. They go back and forth quite a bit and have some fabulous dialog. Alexa is a fighter, and Louis is right by her side.

This took a while for me to get into, mostly because I wasn't quite feeling the connections between the

I'll be the first to admit that neither paranormal nor romance are among my favourite genres, and when the two genres are combined... well, that's usually a recipe for a cliché-ridden disaster in my book. Lots and lots of eye-rolling and sighing ensue when I, against my better judgment, begin reading yet another paranormal romance story (Why do I keep reading it? I must be a masochist on some level). I'll also admit that the main reason I bought this book was because it was only 99 cents and came recommended by a friend of mine.

Frankly, my expectations weren't very high. But I was very pleasantly surprised by this story. Its characters were believable (albeit at times a bit volatile, but that's ok), relatable and likable, and the story steers clear of most of the clichés of its genre (not all, but most) and has a few surprising twists along the way that I certainly didn't see coming. It doesn't revolutionise the genre but adds a few interesting details to common vampire lore that I quite liked. For some reason, I think of it as True Blood set in Europe. (I LOVE the tv-show True Blood, or I did, for the first few seasons before it got lame and over the top.) It doesn't plagiarise True Blood in any way, it's just that the feel of it is the same; witty dialogue, good pace. It's like True Blood, while True Blood was still good.

All in all, a good, solid 3-star read (3 stars is a good rating in my book), and I definitely plan to read the next book in the series. So in short: If you're a fan of this genre, this book will not disappoint you, and even if you don't normally like books in this genre, there's still a good chance that you might enjoy this story.

As part of Alina Popescu's Blog Tour for celebrating the release of her new novel "The Edge of Hope", I had the chance to read the book – and am I ever glad that I did!

I am a huge fan of vampires, at least when it comes to books that are well written. As such, I know that the topic can get repetitive. I have to admit that I started reading TEOF with mixed feelings, but I quickly cast all doubts aside and let the story carry me away. The author has managed the difficult mix between keeping some of the traditional framework intact and adding nice little twists. Vampire folklore isn't exactly re-invented, but Anthony, Louis, Heshra and the rest aren't your every-day bloodsuckers either. Without revealing too many spoilers, let me just tell you three things: These vampires have a hierarchy and heritage

all of their own. These vampires might seem like humans some of the time, but they prove to have special abilities, too. These vampires are freaking attractive, so beware of some major fangirling. Oh, and did I mention that these vampires don't sparkle in the sunlight?

All that aside, I found more to like about Popescu's debut novel that is the first instalment of the "Bad Blood Series". Take Alexa, the heroine, for example. She came alive right from the first few sentences and she's somebody a lot of people could identify with. As a strong-willed woman who has been tossed around by life—and men—and falls into depression sometimes, but hasn't given up on life, she can teach us a thing or two about how to fight for what we believe in and what we want. Being a writer myself, I found it fascinating that the main character is a writer and that the story circles around another story, namely, her own vampire novel. Clever trick!

We get treated to the obligatory bad guy and to the one and only Mr. Right—or should I say, Vampire Right?—for Alexa and there's quite some chemistry and steam to be enjoyed. As paranormal romance goes, this is a wonderful read. The witty dialogs, the fast-paced action after some introductory chapters and the cliff-hanger ending all work together to create a tight, interesting story that isn't just any other vampire fiction, but has the potential to stand out. I can't help it, I keep imaging the book as a TV series or a movie because it is so promising. What an awesome debut that leaves you wanting more—preferably the sequel, right now!

Make no mistake Alina Popescu's vampires in Edge of Hope do not sparkle and they do not drink animal blood! The plot is well formed and as compelling as the vampires themselves; I finished the book within a day; but the history Alina Popescu creates of the vampire's origins is more complicated than in any other paranormal novel I have read. Yet it is exactly from this this vision of the author's which the strong, single-minded, human blood-drinking vampire emerges.

When the reader meets Alexa she is in Malta, trying to write a vampire story and avoiding an interview with an overly interested journalist. However, her meeting with Anthony is inevitable, as is their ensuing relationship but when he emails her to ask her to live with him for a month in Amsterdam I did scream "Nooooooo" at my Kindle, but then that would be the end of the story right??!

Thankfully the reader never views Alexa as weak because Alina Popescu shows that she is at war in her head over agreeing to visit Amsterdam and reveals how Anthony manipulates Alexa's insecurities about not wanting to return to Bucharest.

In Amsterdam Alexa is forced to welcome the good and worst elements of being a member of the paranormal world. Alina Popescu's writing becomes darker, as she heightens the sense of unease and apprehension which surrounds the characters. The reader is introduced to Louis and Hesrah, two vampires who Alexa befriends. I love the first time Hesrah gets drunk, a brilliant moment!

The relationship between Alexa and Louis is complicated by a blood bond and an intense sexual chemistry, but Alina Popescu still teases the reader with their continual flirting and banter!

The Edge of Hope is an excellent story BUT I was left gasping in shock at its cruel cliffhanger and I have discovered that book two may not be released until the Autumn :(! I recommend that you go buy this book . .but read SLOWLY!!!!
