This story wasn't my cup o' tea, and I do tend to read a lot of romance novellas. I found this one to be a bit more on the tame-and-awkward side of the scale. Again, though, that's just me. Obviously other people have read it and enjoyed it a lot. But here is my take:

The characters were noticeably stilted and uninteresting for me. So much so that when Mason (I read the entire story in a few hours and actually had to look at the synopsis in another tab just to find his name, that's how unmemorable all the characters were to me) said he thought Janie intrigued him when they first met, I immediately rolled my eyes and burst out laughing. All she did when they first met was stare at him, and, eventually, she started quipping. Or trying to. Even when she was trying to be witty, she was pretty boring in my tastes. Another problem I have with this story is that everyone is ~magically~ telepathic -- knowing EXACTLY what to say at the right time -- without actually being telepathic. It's cheesy.

I'm not going to list everything I didn't like about this book, of course. But one thing that grated me a little later on in the story was when Janie was super awkward and quiet around Mason and wishing he would tell her more about himself; it's just... why don't you just ASK him to tell you more about himself? That makes
