I really looked forward to read this non-shifter book for weeks, and was happy when I finally flipped open page one. Ouch, a couple typos right at the beginning, main characters with blue eyes one second and warm brown ones on the next page. With a great storyline I could've easily overlooked those simple slips. But the further I got into the book, the less I liked it.

This was the first novel I've read by this author, but it won't be the last, lol. Definitely because I'm looking forward to the next instalment in this series.

I debated giving this book a cliffhanger tag. On the one hand, it is a cliffhanger in the sense of there isn't a HEA and, I feel, it ends abruptly at quite an intense moment, in particular where the MMMM and menage aspect that is spoken about in the blurb is concerned. However, there is a HFN, but it's not finished, not by a long shot. Do I regret reading the book now and having to wait to find out more? No, definitely not. It was a very good and entertaining read. The characters are rock solid and there is also a good explanation of the Alpha/beta/omega classification which is often lacking in omegaverse stories at the moment.

There is also an ongoing mystery involving dangerous situations that have a potential to turn deadly which grabs the attention nicely. The interplay of a suspense novel and a romance novel is very well done, each playing off the other without either taking over the book. That in and of itself is quite a feat as far as I'm concerned.

Now I just have a wait for the next instalment to come along. Hopefully it won't be too long *grin*

Another great omegaverse book, this time in a modern setting.

The players:

Lidon – Alpha. Cop. Commanding but tender.

Enar – Alpha. Doctor. Caring but also needs to be taken care of.

Palani – Beta. Reporter. A bit too mouthy for his own good.

Vieno – Omega. Personal assistant. Sweet, dipped in sugar and everyone wants to lick him.

It's suppose to be an MMMM romance, and in a way it is, but in this first book there isn't any sex where all four men are involved. There is plenty of sex however between... well... all of them, just not together. The

heat level is off the charts.

Palani and Vieno are childhood friends and lovers, but complications with his heat require that Vieno take on an alpha's help, because Palani, as a beta is not enough. His doctor Enar, who's very understanding and compassionate, could help, but he's not strong and dominant enough to handle Vieno, so the good doctor asks his best friend for help. Lidon thinks they all crazy. But there's something about the little omega that draws him in, also his not a heartless bastard to just leave an omega in pain.

The dynamic between the men got disrupted thanks to that encounter and other more pressing issues. There's confusion and heartbreak. Around the 50% mark I felt I was reading two books with two couples (and I mean that as a compliment). One couple was more romantic, sweet, and tender with each other, while the other couple was more playful and they were still in the early stages of them getting to know each other. But at the same time the four of them belonged together and it was there all along just below the surface, the author didn't let us forget that.

There's also a hint of mystery in the story, regarding birth control pills and suicidal omegas, and their profession connects them together even more, even Vieno. He's kind of in the center of all this.

So we didn't see the four men together yet, and we also didn't see the mystery get solved. The whole thing will unfold in the second book. I loved how the author – deliberately or not, but definitely in a clever way – dragged it out. The four men needed to go slow, otherwise it would've felt very rushed, and sloppy, it would've been all about the sex.

Highly recommend it to omegaverse lovers, but keep in mind their story isn't finished, there's a second book, and there will be a third? We'll see.

And I was about to be really upset. The more I delved into this book the sadder I got about these guys getting separated and divided and lumped together differently. Everyone was sad and no one could figure out what was up and I was ripping my hair out going OMG!! But this book was amazing. The only reason I even put it down was because I had a headache. And I tried to read through it. It's so goooooood.

Vieno and Palani have been together for 3 years. Vieno an omega. Palani a beta. Because Palani is not an alpha, he cannot give Vieno what he needs during his heat. And it's killing them. Vieno quite literally. Enar is a doctor, an alpha with beta tendencies, who helps people. And a lot of it illegally. He's called in to see what can be done to save sweet Vieno. He knows what Vieno needs but because Vieno was raped before, no one wants to call in a random alpha. Knowing his best friend Lidon, an alpha, is on the edge from lack of sex, he figures Lidon can help Vieno through his heat and give them both everything they need. Which means Palani has to watch his lover mate with another man. And Enar has to stay as a doctor to make sure all is ok. Afterward, Vieno is much better but it's a hard thing to get over. Everyone is feeling everything about each other. There's lust, desire, guilt, and a whole lot more. When another situation arises, Lidon is asked to marry and mate Vieno. He does. And what should be a happy time since they are mated, turns out to be

awful. Palani is Vieno's soulmate and vice versa. Enar feels like he's losing everyone. All this in the midst of an investigation that puts them all in danger. They must figure out a way to stay safe and figure out how to all coexist. And what they learn leaves them all breathless and surprised. Maybe they will all get their happily ever after.

Holy hells bells. Ok. First of all. Cliffhanger. Oh my gah. What a way to end it. Wow. I need more!!! Second of all, these characters. They are so complex. Each has a side to them that is unseen and when it comes out it's breathtaking. Lidon, being the hardass, no nonsense, gruff alpha, becomes the sweetest, kindest, softest man who tries so hard to care for those around him. Especially Vieno. Vieno, who's supposed to be this docile, meek omega, and he is in some ways, but he has a backbone of steel. He voices his opinion even when he's terrified to do so. Afraid of the repercussions. Enar, a supposed hard ass alpha, likes being dominated and taken. He also stands up for what is right, even when he knows it could cost him his job and reputation. And gorgeous Palani. The beta who is often overlooked because he's stuck in between. He's too much in some ways and not enough in others. His job as a journalist often seems like he's getting nowhere but his nose sniffs out everything. He stands up and go against those who are wrong at the cost of his life. All of these guys are so different but inexplicably drawn together by fate. They bob and weave against all they comes against them and come together in a way that no one expected. But hey. To be happy sometimes you have to do the unexpected.

I had never read Nora Phoenix before and I wasn't sure what to expect from this book going into it. I certainly didn't expect to be so sucked into the story that I couldn't put it down! It was interesting and emotional with complex relationships, romance and lots of hot sex with four men I instantly cared about.

Following two sets of long-time friends who are now two sets of best friends with benefits and how they are thrown together under unlikely circumstances, I fell for every single character. Each one was distinct and well-drawn and each one is dealing with different issues. Beta Palani and Omega Vieno have such a touching relationship and my heart broke for each of them. Lidon and Enar are both Alphas but are very different from each other. Lidon is a protector and he is protecting a huge secret for Enar. When Lidon connects with Vieno after Enar arranges for him to help Vieno through his heat, all four of the men's worlds are about to be changed forever. While the m/m/m/m storyline isn't completely resolved by the end, and there is no actual pregnancy storyline yet, there are major changes for all the relationships.

Underlying the story is the start of a storyline that deals with a conspiracy affecting the lives and health of omegas that seems to have players throughout the government, police and healthcare industry that some will do anything to protect. There is also a hint of things to come including a possible change to the old ways when men used to be able to shift into wolves.

The story definitely has a bit of everything. It is a cliffy with Enar really struggling with his own internal conflict and the changing relationships, but the next two books are already out and I immediately jumped right into book two.

Although there does seem to be certain "rules" for Omegaverse I enjoy discovering how each author interprets those rules and delivers their own version.
