I always enjoy reading mystery stories or a good police procedural/Thriller type. This book is about a Private eye, who admits to having a shady past, even a prison sentence. All this does nothing to help his new career, especially having a brother and a father in law enforcement. Let's just say, black sheep of the family.

I liked the angle the story was coming from and it did have great potential, however I found the writing to be a bit too stilted to flow naturally. some threads were working too slow and other too unbelievable, which I do normally allow a lot of leeway as it is a mystery and fiction, with this book though, too many coincidences and lucky happenings kept me grounded in reality. I could not work out if the writer was aiming to shock, and missed, or perhaps not to get too gritty or bloody and upset the readers. It settled in two steps above a cozy mystery.

The ending, in my opinion, happened too neatly and too quickly. A light bulb moment.

Perhaps I just prefer more mystery and more grit in my books. I'm not saying do not read. I finished it, even if it took me many sittings and I would recommend this book to readers of detective books. I think the author has great potential, especially if he could allow the relationships within the characters to develop a bit more.

Thomson's series, "Quinn Gets His Kicks", nothing about the beating death of one time boxing foe, and good friend Junior Flores is as it seems. Flores has been found beaten and dead in an alley. A packet of heroin in his pocket, and his body left in a bad part of town . Junior has been clean for a very long time and even put his marriage to Karen back together after many years of jail , and rehabs. Quinn works as an insurance investigator for Philadelphia Mutual Insurance Company. Since he works on commission only, investigating Junior's death will be an on his own investigation. Junior had been working as a handyman/ janitor for the Chester County Elite Soccer Club. The soccer team's star player Patrick Amapikwe is 15, and looking to score a big time payday signing for one of soccer's top pro soccer teams. Patrick's agent David B. Davidson is a shifty character to be sure. Coach Crck of the Chester team learned soccer growing up behind the "Iron Curtain". Crck knows he's got to shield Patrick from the likes of Davidson and worse. Before getting very far with Junior's case Quinn has a hand grenade tossed onto his balcony blowing a huge hole into his apartment. Getting nearly killed by the grenade is about one of the easiest things Quinn has to go up against to unravel what happened to Junior. Quinn's family, especially brother Davy (A Cop), give Liam virtually no support. It's Nora Garcia de Sorias, the daughter of his boss that gives Liam any confidence to push solving the case. Having to battle with the likes of " Vin the Shin", Johnny Terrasini, and several Philadelphia PD homicide detectives make Quinn's life just as miserable as possible on this case. Every bit as good a read as the first book in the series, "Quinn Checks In", this one was pretty well crafted with Philadelphia as it's setting. Topping off at about 190 pages, this yarn packs a thrill a page as it flies at breakneck speed. Plenty of action scenes, and very unique characters really add to the reading enjoyment here. Expertly set within the wonderful neighborhoods that comprise Philadelphia add to the depth of the story. So far reading two of author L.H. Thomson's Quinn books, he's becoming a pretty good story teller. Quinn hasn't had an easy day in his life and hopefully soon he'll realize how much Nora stands behind him for making future romance possible. Series has nine books in it, and I'm almost done with the third book already. This is easily a five stars out of a possible five stars for, "Quinn Gets His Kicks". A very interesting series to jump into. "Youse" all should be reading and cheering for Quinn.
