When they are reunited at their 5 year reunion, things heat up again but come to an abrupt end. Now it's their 10 year reunion and Savannah is back for it mainly because Sam is working overseas and won't be around. However, Sam has other ideas and they are once again thrust together.

There were so many good aspects to this book. Normally I'm not a big fan of flashbacks in movies, television shows or books but in this case they worked and they worked well. I loved seeing Savy and Sam's young relationship through now adult eyes and I especially liked that they were triggered by a specific moment.
