When I first started reading, it took me a little while to get into. I couldn't really figure out who Dylan was or what her issues were, it was obvious there were some but I wasn't connecting to her at first.

The story soon picked up once Jeremy turned up and I was gripped by him, hook line and sinker. There's a tangible spark between the two main characters that did make it very difficult for me to put the book down. Theresa, Dylan's best friend is also a great character but I would have loved to see more of her.
