This book could've been really interesting and even good had the second half of the book not happened. the attempt at a happy ending completely ignored both of the trauma that both of the characters went through due to Father Aaron and the super fucked up shit that Callum himself put Ava through. That kind of trauma leaves extremely deep scars that therapy would help but not likely cure completely. I honestly think the book would have had a more satisfying ending if Callum and Ava had died in the fire as well instead of making some fucked up assumption that trauma bonding equals true love.

The writer had a good idea and she even wrote it well at times, it just fell short of what it could have been. I hope the writer keeps writing, however. She has a lot of promise.
