Detective Camille Martell's obsession with catching a sexual predator leads to a young girl being taken and her suspended from the police force. With a feeling of guilt so strong it almost suffocates her, she turns to her ex-mentor on the force who runs a private investigation agency and finds herself partnered with Drago Nance, a man she had a steamy weekend with once upon a time and a man she hasn't seen in four years.

Her latest obsession, finding the serial killer known as Angel has landed her on suspension from the force. And while she knows that her job is on the line, her overwhelming guilt cannot let this one go. So she turns to her old partner, Justus who now runs a PI firm. Justus decides that he has just the man for the job...his brother, Drago Nance.

Drago has earned his PI license after spending 6 months in jail. He is a vigilante of sorts – the head on an anti-gang group. When he comes face to face with their new client – shocked is only one of the emotions that

begins flowing through him. He has never forgotten Camille or the weekend that they spent together shortly before he was incarcerated. He may never have called her, but he definitely never forgot her.

Working together to solve the latest missing persons case involving Angel proves to be challenging in more ways than one. Camille and Drago fight their attraction tooth and nail. They both still feel the pull that was between them four years ago but they are so different. Or are they? With a young girl's life in the balance and emotions that are threatening to surface, can Drago and Camille survive the heat?

Overall, I thought this was a good book. The suspense definitely added to the story and I really enjoyed that part of it.
