A decent story of political intrigue set in a Medieval, Omegaverse kingdom, it's a nice twist on an omega prince in danger and a gruff, studly, dark, and potentially dangerous Alpha knight keeping an eye on him.

My initial reaction is it is not a four star read for me, but better than many/most three star reads. It is a typical but interesting medieval romance, just done Alpha-Beta-Omega style. It ends o.k., without resolution but at a decent stopping point. However, the teaser for the second installment ends with a bit of a cliffhanger.

Okay let's take a look at it. First of all there were quite a number of spelling mistakes, as well as sentences that were a bit awkwardly phrased, but for the most part it was good. Sometimes it was a little confusing to understand what was going on, especially who was doing a particular action: the writing used 'he' too much instead of names when there were multiple male characters in a scene.

The characters were interesting. Didn't really get to know them too well considering how short the book was, but I was pleased enough with them. I would have liked more focus on Riven, so we could get to know him more.

Of course this story is omegaverse, so I must comment on that. The dynamics weren't too much of a focus, until you come to the sex scene and HAY it's self-lubing butts and knotting.
