Reunions have me fascinated, so to read a short story that is basically about the reunion of friends who lost touch with each other was a real treat. The story isn't complicated, and the reason they lost touch is stupid - when you think about it logically – which lovers often do not. The emotions between Brand and Kia are sweet , very touching, and, luckily, strong enough for them to start talking again .

Brand has a hard time first, deciding if he can forgive Kia for stopping to respond to his letters and phone calls. Not that there is ever any real question, but he does feel hurt. By the time he realizes he is as much to blame for giving up as Kia is for trying to minimize the pain, he is ready to truly move forward.

Kia has had a hard time trying to minimize the pain by cutting the connection they had – and not succeeding. Coming back to apologize is even harder, but he has no choice, in a way, because he loves Brand so much.

If you like reunions, sweet stories and characters rediscovering their love for each other in a Christmas setting, you will probably love this story.
