On the run, Anna Moder finds refuge with the Crescent Valley pack, but is forced to leave when her abusive ex learns of her location. On the road once again, Anna crosses paths with bounty hunter Caleb Graham after she treats his gunshot wound, and the two join forces. But can Anna trust the man/werewolf or does he have his own agenda?

This installment is different from the previous books as the majority of the action takes place away from Grundy and the rest of the pack. The focus is primarily on Anna and Caleb's relationship as it grows from wariness, to trust, to intimacy and to love.

Anna is a resilient heroine and the details of the abuse that she suffered, both mental and physical, evoke a range of emotions on the part of the reader - horror, anger, admiration and pride at her taking control of her life once again.

Caleb is simply scrumptious. An incredible mix of physical strength combined with a tender gentleness when it comes to his feelings for Anna make him a truly wonderful hero.

The story is engaging and Harper manages to avoid all the pitfalls that could become irritating, such as the silly misunderstanding trope. My only caveat is that (view spoiler). My blood thirstiness is not appeased!

Amanda Ronconi's narration is entertaining and engaging. She presents both the humor as well as the more serious moments with just the right tone.

On a final note, fans of the Jane Jameson series will be tickled pink by the cameo appearance of a couple of characters. For me, however, this was problematic as the sudden introduction of vampires (about whom the entire world is aware) is incongruent with the presentation in this series of supernatural creatures, particularly werewolves, as secretive and hidden from the outside world.

*How to Run with A Naked Werewolf* is the third book in Molly Harper's *Naked Werewolf* series, and probably my favorite of the three. It's fun, sassy, sexy, exciting... entertaining, start to finish!

### **Cover Blurb**

Caleb Graham is a werewolf by nature, a tracker by profession. He uses his "extra gifts" to find people, and not always in the most legal or ethical manner. He doesn't care what they've done, or who wants them found, as long as his considerable fee is paid. He likes his life simple and uncomplicated.

Anna Moder, former physician to Caleb's pack, happens across Caleb during a particularly violent "negotiation" that has left him bloodied and unconscious. She helps him, despite the fact that he's cost her a car, so he insists that she stay with him on the road for a while. As they grow closer, Anna looks past the gruff exterior and the questionable job to thoroughly decent werewolf underneath.

Anna – who is careful to edit her involvement with Caleb's pack from their conversations – doesn't talk about why a nice girl wants to live in the middle of frozen nowhere, but she's obviously on the run from something. When Anna's past collides with Caleb's current assignment from one of his sleazier contacts, Caleb finally has to make a choice—protect his job...or his potential mate?

Molly Harper is one funny author! She's got a talent for writing stories that pull me in and don't let go because they're not only interesting, but romantic and witty, too. The dialogs – both spoken and internal - are filled with tongue in cheek humor, and I find that I just can't help but fall in love with the main couples, over and over again.

This particular story was a bit more angsty and poignant as it touches on spousal abuse in some of its darkest forms. While it wasn't terribly graphic, there's enough there to know that things were not pretty. It tore my heart out to know what Anna endured and gave me the insights I needed to understand why she continually runs, especially from the people she cares about.

I simply adored Caleb! There was something so naïve and vulnerable about him and yet, so extraordinarily alpha, too. His desire to protect Anna from harm while at the same time allow her to be herself was absolutely endearing and has made him my favorite hero of the series, so far.

Despite Anna's background, she was just plain fun! I loved how she thought she was being so clever, pulling the wool over Caleb's eyes, only to learn that regardless of what she did, he still loved her. This added a certain... something... to their relationship that had me cheering them on towards *their happily ever after!*

Anna Moder has moved all over the country, constantly changing her identity and hiding from her ex-husband for years. Recently she left the only place that has felt like home in a long time – a valley in Alaska where she was a werewolf pack doctor. She never exposed her past to them, so when her abusive, possessive, crazy husband gets close to finding her, Anna ups and runs away again. She ends up in another Alaska small town, working as a store clerk and living in a seedy motel. Leaving work that night, she comes across two men arguing. When gun shots are heard, she finds herself rescuing a man whose been shot. She gets him to safety and soon learns the man she's rescued is a werewolf.

Caleb Graham is a werewolf from the same valley where Anna used to work, yet their paths had never crossed since he's always on the road working as a bounty hunter, hunting down his next paycheck. His life is simple and uncomplicated, until he meets Anna, who smells like 'home' to him. He decides he wants to put Anna in his back pocket and keep her and does everything possible to keep his scared little 'rabbit', Anna, from running away from him. They embark on a few bounty hunting gigs while Caleb agrees to take Anna to Anchorage where she will obtain her new secret identity and new life from the woman whose been helping her all these years.

Between beautiful scenic views of Alaska, bar fights, criminals, seedy motels, greasy food and diners, I was taken on an exciting adventure as these two bonded and found love. But there are obstacles, of course. They have both been keeping the truth about their lives from each other. As they spend day and night together, the barriers start to dissipate and their secrets are slowly revealed -- all while sexing it up on the side.

I love that Anna is a smart and strong heroine, with a sweet, quirky side. What she went through with her husband is horrible and sad indeed – my heart broke for her. But she persevered through it all and rose up to reclaim her life. She still had some trust issues that remained prevalent throughout most of the story – with good reason. But she learns to trust again with Caleb and starts to finally see the light at the end of her dark and lonely road.

I thought it was ironic the man she falls hard for is a big bad werewolf. Caleb is the exact opposite of her husband. Actually, there is no comparison whatsoever! He may be a dominant werewolf, but he would never hurt Anna. He's kind, patient, and protective. Caleb gave Anna the respect, happiness, and love she truly deserved. And, in turn, Anna helped Caleb learn how to see the more human side to the people he captures, not just a paycheck. He also discovers with Anna that he's finally ready to put roots down.

***How to Run with a Naked Werewolf (book #3)*** was an adorable charming 8.40 hrs audiobook narrated by Amanda Ronconi to listening to this week.

*How to Run with a Naked Werewolf* is not all fun and games. It is a bit darker than the first two books. The main theme, domestic violence combined with stalking, is not easy to present with a lot of humour. I won't hold this against the book though. I didn't expect it, true, but I still ended up with a good story. Molly Harper accomplished this by moving the story out of the Crescent Valley (more than two thirds of the book) and making our two protagonists move a lot across Alaska.

The beginning is a bit confusing because the book starts with the pack doctor Anna Moder on the run. It is so sudden because there was nothing in the other two books to show that Anna has a reason to run. Later you find out about her abusing husband. The reasons for running again are noble and understandable. She is a likeable character. When push comes to shove she is a fighter. Anna's memories of her marriage made me see red. I could hardly wait for the creep to get what he deserves.

As for Caleb, he is almost perfect. As a bounty hunter, he spends most of his time away from home. That's the reason they haven't met before. I like who Anna ends up with. For most of the book, they work together tracking people.

Anyway, although there is less humour here because of Anna's past, it is still there and it is still an enjoyable way to spend an afternoon. The truth is you need to be in the mood for this series. That way you will overlook certain things and pay attention to the more entertaining ones. I had that luck.

I always enjoy a new Molly Harper book, though this one won't be a favorite. Don't get me wrong, everything I love about Harper's work is present: wit, banter, humor, romance, fun characters, with a touch of mayhem and hijinks.

I just didn't connect very well with Anna and even Caleb left me a little cold (and that's unusual for a hunky bad-boy with a heart). I thought both of them went a little too long keeping secrets they didn't need to keep. Plus, Anna's backstory was a little too... I dunno, trendy? I guess I'm a bit burned out on the whole "deranged, obsessive ex" as a plot/danger device.

Since this is the third in a series, you should know by now what you're getting into. If you haven't read the rest, wouldn't recommend starting here. Harper doesn't leave you hanging, or anything, but there's important backstory you're going to want to have.

I think I say this every time I read a Molly Harper book. Molly Harper is an easy go-to read for me, one that I know will make me laugh, I know the path and trajectory of the novel and characters but it still keeps me smiling. *How to Run with a Naked Werewolf* is no exception. This is a quick, easy and fun read. There are no big surprises in storyline, just a good and slow building of sexual tension and romance, funny and

sarcastic flirting, and the quirky atmosphere of a Molly Harper storyline.

“In my time with the valley pack, I’d met werehorses, were-bears, and even a tragically less cool wereskunk named Harold.”

“I shook off the Norman Bates flashbacks and told myself it was just like any of the other crappy indigent motels I’d stayed at in any number of cities, and I hadn’t been stabbed in the shower yet. There was that one time a crazy lady kicked down my door and accused me of sleeping with her husband, but it turned out she’d meant to break into the room across the hall.”

“I sprang up from the floor and jumped on her back to slow her down, but man, she was fast on those big plastic heels. “Get off me!” she shouted as I dragged her backwards. “No!” I said. “Give us the ring.” OK, now I definitely felt like Gollum.”

Run with a Naked Werewolf deals with a heavier story line than many of Harper’s books. The heroine is on the run from an abusive ex-husband and she is dealing with the emotional trauma of having suffered for years with him. Harper deals with this topic fairly, but still manages to keep the story upbeat and funny.

“So, with the portable wireless hot spot I persuaded him to buy from the cellphone store, I was able to (a) help with Internet research and (b) avoid the Alaskan version of hipsters who frequented Internet cafes.”

If you haven’t listened to the audio book version of Molly Harper’s books, I would suggest to go out and start – start with this series in fact. Having listened to the majority of her books and read only a few, I think Harper’s books were meant to be performed. They are laugh out loud – ugly snorts – funny. The humor carries over in the books, but the delivery is just better when narrated.

The first book in this series is the strongest, it is hard to top Mo and Coop’s story (and they appear briefly in this book). But How to Run is a decent book, good fun and a solid 3.5 stars.

**How to Run With a Naked Werewolf** was moving romance filled with fun humor, and a little scary suspense thrown in.

Anna Moder is on the run from an abusive husband. She spent a few years in Grundy, Alaska as the wolf pack's doctor. They needed a physician willing to "doctor" records so no one would find out their secrets and Anna needed a place to stay in anonymity. She spent a few years in relative peace until she got an email saying her husband was on to her, again. Anna's moved on spending a few months here and there working random jobs that don't require ID, and she is making her way to Anchorage to set up a more permanent, and hopefully, untraceable identity. That is until she gets caught up in a shooting and ends up with Caleb Graham sticking to her like glue. How is it possible that Anna of all people ends up with Caleb, the bounty hunter cousin to the wolf pack she left in Grundy?

After Anna saves Caleb in the shooting, he won't let her out of his sight, and he promises to take Anna to Anchorage. But she's suspicious of Caleb and petrified that somehow he'll find out who she is and turn her into her husband. Still, Anna has no better options unless she plans on hitchhiking with questionable people all the way over. At least she knows Caleb by reputation from his family, the pack.

There's a building attraction and Anna can't help but fall for Caleb a little more each day she spends with him. The easy affection and the way he cares for without even a thought is so comforting and nothing like her oppressive husband. She's able to be herself without repercussions, and Caleb likes her more for it. But Anna's afraid to let her guards down, afraid to let anyone in for fear they become victims, too; which is the whole reason she left Grundy, the pack and her little slice of happiness.

I felt so horrible for Anna, she fell for someone who was deceptively nice and who gradually took over her life until he dominated every aspect, and even that wasn't enough for that evil man! Unfortunately, her husband is one smart SOB so staying under the radar is very difficult. Although, Anna isn't the person she used to be, not the type to just sit there and take it lying down. And now she has Caleb at her back, the big scary werewolf, with the soft-center heart.
