Technically Marriage is a contract between two people, where they are joining their lives with a plan to have children who will be their heirs. Often if one of the partners come into the marriage with substantially more worth than the other a prenuptial agreement is signed. The big thing missing in this story than most marriages is love, fondness, caring, strong desire to be with one another in order to to build a life together. Background checks aren't run. Children are hoped for, but fertility isn't checked prior to marriage.

For us hopeless romantics, marriage is the ultimate expression of love. Of unification of hearts & families / friends. Marriage as a business arrangement is the antithesis of our ideal marriage. In this Beau Brown book the author encapsulates the romantic in the Omega Rider, who is feeling his biological clock ticking down so he goes to a Matchmaker. He is both happy and disappointed with Jax's Marriage Proposition.

A pragmatic Alpha Jax doesn't want a flighty, silly young man who might be very fertile, but could easily get bored with his long work hours and stray. He does want someone capable of bearing heirs, yet sensible enough mainly due to his age that the chances of him becoming a Dad are diminishing. As appealing as Jax tries to make the marriage business deal sound he sees the disappointment in Rider's reaction. But Jax's heart has already been claimed & no one else will ever occupy that space as the past twenty years has certainly demonstrated.

The adorable cover is a precursor of things to come, its not an easy road. Along the journey there are crater sized potholes, malevolent forces to sabotage a growing attraction, doubt, fear, insecurities, past lovers abound. But the slow build up to more than companionship is sweet to behold - though not to some. Leaps of faith are required.

The changes in Jax's personality and routines become noticeable by those in his circle. He actually smiles and even (gasps!) laughs. Jax finds himself wanting to woo Rider. There is something compelling about this young man. He wants Rider more than a bed warmer, heir maker, and business partner. It scares Jax, but the thought of losing Rider scares him even more.

I truly enjoyed this book. There was suspense and angst. But ultimately what I crave a well deserved HEA, something both Rider & Jax deserved.
