Lucy Bright's whirlwind romance and plans for a fairy tale wedding to her boss Rupert Henshawe come to an sudden end when she finds out she's been used as a publicity stunt and her Prince Charming turns out to be the ugly frog.

The heroine Lucy is a survivor. She's impulsive, passionate, resilient and bubbly yet with substance. I really liked her as the heroine of this book. Nathaniel Hart, Lucy's knight in shining armor is a very intriguing character. There's lot more to him than meets the eye and he has a tragic back-story.

The romance in this short book was very nice. It was subtle despite the immediate chemistry between Nat and Lucy and very fitting the line and story. Liz Fielding has a lovely and agreeable writing style that pulls you in immediately. There's subtle humor and she also almost imperceptibly adds the characters' back-stories into the rest of the story. It's fast-paced without unnecessary information or descriptions.

I thoroughly enjoyed my first encounter with Liz Fielding's work. MISTLETOE AND THE LOST STILETTO is a very cute story that gets you in the mood for Christmas and Christmas shopping (I know, I know...it's frigging April/almost May but there were circumstances that prevented me from ARC-reviewing this book, to my utter shame...).

Nathaniel presides over his families legacy with a feeling of entrapment, his heart and mind frozen with the tragedies of the past. Lucy Bright brings the first light into his soulless existence for a very long time.

With all the elements of a Gothic Beauty and the Beast with Twitter, Lucy finds her real fairy tale happy ending.

This is a lovely and emotional tale of two people needing rescuing who find each other at the perfect moment. Highly recommended if you like a sweet story with underlying sizzle and a very satisfying ending.

This is a "romance in a day" book. The heroine discovers her whirlwind, Cinderella romance is a total fraud - literally, and runs from the manipulative now-ex fiance (as of the opening pages of the book) into a large Harrod's-like department store in London in the days before Christmas. Because she has a file proving the ex's misdeeds, he sends his bodyguards after her. The hero is NOT the ex. He's the manager of the store who catches the heroine when she almost falls on the stairs. They have a MOMENT, and then she runs again, fearing he'll call her ex. He doesn't, feeling protective of her. The heroine is mistaken for a temp-agency person and spends the rest of the day as one of Santa's elves in the store version of Santa's workshop, making little children happy. This is just a nice, sweet, Christmasy read. I usually like Fielding's books and this one is no exception.

Ms Fielding gives the Cinderella story a fun, modern twist with a social networking heroine.

Lucy Bright has everything. She thinks she's met her Prince Charming and after a whirlwind romance is planning a fairytale wedding. But a chance discovery exposes her Prince for the frog he really is and her new world comes crashing down.

She makes her escape into a large department store but loses one of her Christian Louboutin stilettos along the way and bumps into retail magnate Nathaniel Hart. She disappears again and hides out in his store, but neither of them can ignore the instant attraction they feel.

I love Lucy B - she's fresh, vulnerable and says what she thinks even though she knows she probably shouldn't. Nathaniel is a gorgeous tortured hero punishing himself for something that happened in his past. Together they are perfect - each one rescuing the other.

Ms Fielding yet again delivers a beautifully written story full of emotion, with characters I will remember long after finishing it. The final scene had me closing the book with that warm glow and satisfied 'aah' that all romance readers are looking for and all aspiring romance writers wish they could achieve. Frankly, I am in awe!

Thank you Ms Fielding for such an enjoyable unputdownable read and for a masterclass in how a romance

novel should be written.

I give this book 5 out of 5. It is one of my favourites this year and now firmly on my keeper shelf. I recommend it to all romance fans who want a feel-good Christmassy read.
