I have to say that this is a fun, but goofy, series. It is quite epic, but also hilarious. The *EXTREME* fanservice is played not just as fanservice but for comedy and hilarity. Hyoudou Issei is very perverted and lecherous. Sadly, due to their unpopularity, Issei, as well as his two friends (called together the "perverted trio" by disgusted girls) have their dreams of a high school girlfriend dashed. That is, until a certain night when Issei dies and as is resurrected as a devil.

No, this isn't truly occultic. It is only occultic in the broadest sense of using some familiar terms. It is about as much a portrayal of Christianity (or most other religions and myths) as *Indiana Jones* is of Christianity and Hinduism. In some ways, *Indiana Jones* is more accurate...

I really was kinda of two minds about the first volume, but the second one here I liked better. The fanservice was toned down (but for this series that still means a lot of it, of course), and the mangaka and artist spent more time on the story and less on humor and even fanservice to some extent.

I also liked the fact that the story portrayed well Issei's desire to save Asia from the fate awaiting her. His heroism and desire to sacrifice for others was what makes him commendable. He is one of the strangest heroic characters ever. You expect your self-sacrificial characters to be pure, not like this.

All in all, it was a fun, and unique, story.

Worry and dread is high in the air over events which took place in the previous volume, but Issei manages to cheer himself and Asia up when they go on a fun friend date. But where happiness goes, misery follows, and Asia is kidnapped by the wicked Yuuma/Raynare! Even though she has a responsibility to the other fallen angels to collect Asia, she is doing so for her own personal reasons-- to steal Asia's Sacred Gear so that she can make people love her! This sounds horrible in itself but what's even worse is that this ritual to take Asia's Sacred Gear will kill her if carried out!

Also, Issei has learned that there is a way, or ways, to promote himself from Pawn to anything above (except for King). Will he be able to save Asia in time? And will this journey and hard fight be what he needs to get his promotion?

Well, it's been a few months over a year since I read volume one, and I barely remember any details from it. But what I'm going for in this series isn't really much of a plot, but something light hearted and funny and not so innocent. It pretty much delivered that too. But this one seemed to develop the story further from the beginning, or most of, volume one. Yuuma (the woman who betrayed and kill our pervy protagonist) has finally been defeated, and the curious issue that I had wondered about has been solved. I'm talking about Asia being a saint but being friends with a group of devils. How in the world is that going to work? Well, if Asia becomes a devil... Which I dreaded. I figured she'd just be careful and end up slipping up and hitting them with her holiness often. Slapstick humor, you know? But nope. Yuuma killed Asia (Issei could have saved her, but he was too much of a pussy even though he tried to save her). Then Rias revived Asia as a devil Bishop to serve her. I honestly don't really have that much to say about this one. It was funny, and the "shitty priest" came back, so I liked that. It gave me some chuckles, as did some other things.

I read this to bring me out of a gloomy mood, which it did, but because of that, my review is pretty shitty. But!
