Un tome dans la continuité du second et du troisième.

On a le droit à un petit changement dans ce tome : pour une fois c'est une âme soeur dominante qui ne veut pas d'un mating parce qu'il aime sa vie telle qu'elle est (et pas à cause d'une angoisse ou traumatisme quelconque) ! A cela s'ajoute un enfant et ça rend le tout bien plus intéressant (Jamie aimerait des enfants d'ailleurs, je suis curieuse de savoir si l'auteure va lui en donner ou pas !).

Jeremy est un personnage qui change également du reste de la série : il n'est ni sexy à tomber ni mignon à croquer, il a une petite bouée autour du ventre et il s'affirme (et pas qu'un peu !).

Côté intrigue de fond, ça n'avance pas beaucoup, dommage.

J'aimerais quand même soulever un point qui m'agace un peu : le côté répétitif de la structure de l'histoire. C'en est presque au point où on pourrait prévoir :

- premier quart : petit problème (rapidement surmonté), découverte de l'âme soeur, mating.
- second quart : premier temps dur de la relation
- troisième quart : monde des bisounours
- dernier quart : deuxième temps dur, retournement de situation, résolution et happy end.

Ce côté répétitif se retrouve aussi du côté relationnel : on se retrouve régulièrement dans la situation "Non, mais il ne me veut pas finalement" et l'autre partie qui répond "Non mais c'était pour te donner le temps de t'habituer à la relation, je veux pas faire quelque chose qui te déplairait". Bref, quiproquo classique mais assez agaçant quand on le voit répété plusieurs fois dans un même roman. J'en suis au point que je lis ces passages en travers (au même titre que ceux de sexe, d'ailleurs) !

D'ailleurs, je ne comprends pas l'auteure qui décrit systématiquement à quel point les mates sont essentiels aux shifters, qu'ils sont les seuls à pouvoir se comprendre parfaitement, qu'ils se complètent à la perfection etc. et qui écrit ensuite que les deux hommes vont tenter de faire fonctionner la relation...Il n'y a rien à tenter puisque ça va FORCEMENT être parfait étant donné qu'ils sont destinés l'un à l'autre. Argh.

Okay, so here we are at book number five and if you've become a Whitedell Pride fan like I have then I don't need to tell you how addictive this series is. This installment introduces us to Jeremy, the first human mate to pop up in the series since Jamie back in the first book. Incidentally, it's Jamie who first befriends Jeremy and pulls him into the pride. It was nice to see Jamie back with a decent amount of page time in this book. And of course, where there's Jamie, there's Keenan. What would a Whitedell Pride story be without a healthy dose of every readers most loved character.

Jeremy is also the first main character to come into these books with a child. Which is a big yay and nay for me. I love it when single dads find themselves someone to love them and their kid, however we all know how damn annoying and poorly written these fictional kiddies can be. But never fear, Adam, Jeremy's son, is a little bundle of well written cuteness who helps show us Denver's softer side.

Denver is a big, growly tiger shifter who didn't want a mate. The fact that his mate comes with a child is just another reason to avoid the human as far as he's concerned. But when Jeremy accidently claims Denver as his mate, Denver mans up and does the best he can to make the most of it. At first I saw Denver as a clichéd silent alpha-ish type who wasn't all that interesting, but he's so awkward and loveably pleased when he does the right thing with Jeremy and Adam that I couldn't help but fall for the guy.

While I enjoyed this story in itself, series wise we also see movement. Oliver, the not-quite-human human who was experimented on back in the first book has reached the point where he's pretty much dying. There's also the introduction of the sugar-glider twins, one of whom is also seriously ill. The need for the pride to kidnap a scientist and find answers has become critical and hopefully we'll see more of this storyline in the next book, which I'm guessing is going to be Oliver. (Maybe. Don't quote me on that!)

As I mentioned in my last review of this series, I would definitely recommend these books be read in order. As the series gets further along the books and characters are becoming even more entwined, to my delight,

but it would leave a reader confused were they to dive in mid series.

Between work and caring for his three year old son, Adam, Jeremy's life is extremely busy leaving not time for anything else. The move to Whitedell has left Jeremy feeling isolated until he met a few of the Whitedell mates and everything changed. Denver is only in Whitedell to protect the member of the pride. Denver has never had a home or family and he liked it that way until he met his mate Jeremy. Jeremy has no idea why he is so attracted to Denver, he has never looked at man man like that. When Denver cut his finger Jeremy innocently licked his finger unknowingly starting their mating bond. Suddenly they world for Jeremy and Adam became a lot more complicated as circumstances force them to work through their differences before their one-way-bond hurts Jeremy. The scientists at the laboratory are not through with their forced study of shifters and once again threatening the lives of the Whitedell Pride as Jeremy is drawn into the fight. This book more than lives up to the earlier stories leaving the reader waiting to see what will happen next.

So I stumbled upon these after reading another Charlie Richards book and realized this is another series involving shifters and their fated mates...

Unfortunately, Leivens' writing tends to lack a bit of Richards' charm. Don't get me wrong, they're enjoyable, but they really start to lose steam quickly, so while I've read more than fifty of Richards' books, I've read five of Lievens', and I'm not sure I care whether or not I read any more.

On top of all that, these all seem like they were run through a translator and then not double checked for accuracy. The mixing up of conjunctions and prepositions smacks of English as a second language. Plus, there's just bizarre wording, both in this book and in subsequent works, that makes me think Lievens isn't entirely comfortable with English.

"Those arms were currently wounded around his neck..."

"...wiggled his browns."

Three times in this book, eyebrows are referred to as "browns". Three. Times.

"...so I want you to look for him and locate him."

"I virtually can't push him to do something he doesn't want..."

Weird shit like that made the text awkward to read. Still, if you're a fan of Charlie Richards, you might get a little thrill out of these low-angst paranormal romps.
