**3.5 Stars** I was pleasantly surprised by this freebie! I will admit the cover is what lured me to read it, but once inside the book, the story captivated me. It had an interesting plot, some intriguing characters including one Jackson Bluewolf, a Native American and adviser on a case where the government is trying to stake claim to an Indian burial ground. Hired to represent the opposing side is Marisa Hancock, an attorney from Maine, who is conflicted on her feelings about the case and Jackson. Although they are pitted against one another in the courtroom, the sparks fly when they cannot deny their attraction and pursue a relationship.

Jackson could be a real jerk and his tendency to fly off the handle started to annoy me, but then he would do something sweet and he was back in my good graces. Marisa finally set him straight, although I wish she had been a little more feisty, held her ground and let him suffer, like he did her. However her assistant, Tracy, more than made up for it with her spunk and snark, a very enjoyable character!

The intimate nature of the book is more suggestive than graphic. The writing got somewhat muddled in the middle of the book, veered off course with dialogue that was more filler than anything. I love dialogue, but I

This was clearly written in the nineties. The description of things and the lack of cellphones/smartphones clearly makes that obvious, as does the writing style and the way the characters talked. Another thing that was obviously nineties is the lack of details in the bedroom, which was refreshing, instead of detailing the sexual act she simply mentioned them making love, which was better than trying to picture all the sexual

moves being described.

Now I feel several kinds of ways about this book, one, it once had a different title, I for one believe they should have left it that way. The new title first claims it's an affair and second makes the tribal aspect more upfront than it really needs to be. Okay I'll speak plainly it's a bit exploitative, "ohhh look the pretty blonde girl is getting down with the Indian"; that may not be what she wanted but it's kinda what I got, considering that the Native American aspects are discussed throughout the book.

The story itself wasn't bad, and I'm glad she took on the concepts of what has been happening on reservations and to those of the first antions, without being too trite or making them into the perfect victims who need to be rescued, yet at the same time, calling out the hypocrisy of the founding fathers discussing freedom while holding slaves.

I liked that she touched on the difficulties of cultural differences in a relationship, but also simply made the story about a man and a woman falling in love. i personally could have done without the character being seen as difficult and unsure simply because she is a virgin. Sexual experience or lack of it, doesn't make one confident or not confident it shouldn't be the be all end all of how women see themselves. I'm not sure why some authors seem to believe you can't be successful and have a well rounded social life as well; but at the same time I guess it worked for her.

At times the male character left much to be desired, I wish they were more details about them than a few lines. The secondary characters could have been a little more fleshed out as well. It's an okay read for such a short book and it still managed to carry a good story, even with the heavy subject matter.
