Since I'm reading an ARC copy it's very possible this could be resolved prior to release. Anslie is an MC Princess, daughter of the Wayward Saints Prez. She was raised by her neglectful mother until she was 16 yrs old. That's when she and Brantley saw each other for the first time. I was fortunate enough to be a Beta reader for this novel.

In this introductory novel to the Wayward Saints MC Series, we meet Anslie when she is a 16 year old girl living with her not-so-motherly mother. It's obvious that she has been living a really hard life since her mother left her father, the president of the Wayward Saints MC. She also has four older brothers who are also part of her father's MC. After fending off the advances of her mother's boyfriend, Steve, Anslie calls her father because she no longer feels at all safe with her mother. Her father comes to bring her to live with him. Once she moves to Vegas, she meets the older and very attractive Brantley, a brother in the same MC as her family.

This story had me hooked from the intense prologue to the finally-it-happened HEA at the end. I loved Anslie and Brantley. They had a connection from the moment they met even though Anslie was off limits not just because she was underage but because she was the Prez's daughter.

The taboo nature of their relationship isn't the only obstacle they have to overcome. This novel takes place over the span of several years and we see Anslie and Brantley torn apart and brought back together several times because life always seemed to get in the way. I loved that even though they were attracted to each other, Anslie was allowed to grow up on her own and really mature into a responsible relationship with Brant. In the end, even through MC rules, exes, secrets, and communication problems, their love and adoration for each other stood the test of time.

There were only a few problems I had with this story and they were minor in the scheme of things. First there were a few grammar errors (wrong name listed and seen instead of saw) but in no way did this distract from the wonderful story telling. Also, I love a good love story and a couple that can express themselves openly through sex but it just seemed odd to me that Anslie during only her second sexual experience allowed Brantley to go beyond traditional and oral sex. It didn't really seem realistic since for most people, especially inexperienced ones, that was a huge step to take in such a new relationship.

The only other issue I saw was that each time Anslie and Brantley had disagreement or breakup, it was always resolved very quickly. The author did an excellent job of creating realistic problems between the characters with appropriate buildup each time but the ensuing apology/makeup was almost nonexistent. I'm not a huge fan of unnecessary angst but it just seemed to be missing during these times. It would have been better for character development and more realistic story progression if they would have taken time actually work through the problems they had.

On other hand, I thought the author did an excellent job of surprising me with the lives of Anslie and

Brantley. Every time I thought I knew the direction the story was taking I was thrown off. It kept me engaged and I read this whole story in basically one sitting. (I even brought my phone to read while I was getting my hair done because I just had to know how the story was going to play out.)

This was an excellent debut and I cannot wait to read the next installment Wayward Sinners.

With NO contact between h & H or h & her family. Years and no one goes to see her? Really? How important could she be? Then something happens, they see each other and all is forgiven! Just like that! No anger, no resentment, no making him pay! ? I have never met this girl! She drove me crazy doing this over and over. It was like she was a very strong girl/woman except with the H. Then all of a sudden she had no backbone. It all made me flip flop on my feelings for the book. At points it was so bad I had to force myself to continue reading.
