What's good: it's not set in Texas and while there's mention of some crazy Texan, that's all there is. A mention. And he eventually comes to the wedding. But there aren't any crazy soldiers/mercenaries/etc that often pop up.

I didn't see what the original publication date is but I'd guess mid-90s. There's a lot of awe surrounding "the computer" and discussion of setting up a web page as if it were some mystery one had to be inducted into.

Kassie is a fine heroine. She's a capable secretary and a just as capable governess/nanny. Do people still use the term governess? They do in DP's Montana.

Gil is really an ass at times. Luckily Kassie doesn't take any of his shit. Go Kassie.

There's an OW who is suitably evil.

This being DP, Kassie is always covered up (except for her one-piece swimsuit which is still suitably demure) and sexually inexperienced.

Kassie has a dramatic background which is so implausible as to be silly but again, fairly typical DP. If Kassie had more of a "normal" traumatic childhood, I may have been able to take this to 2 1/2 stars. But then there's Gil's background - descendent of a British duke. And why not.

Bottom line: this didn't annoy me nearly as much as other DP books and I read it because the one I really wanted to read (Diamond in the Rough) comes after this.
