This book reads like a combination of The Alchemist, Catcher in the Rye and Star Wars. It's coming of age story fraught with dark symbolism and a sense of foreboding both literal and figurative. The main character, a boy named Corvus who is mysteriously followed by a murder of crows, struggles to discover the meaning of his existence while coming to terms with his status as an outsider and learning to harness his growing mystic powers.
