For the record, this is an explicit not for kids kinda read.

I really can't explain why I loved this one so much - nothing about it is my normal type of go to book. I fell in love with this author with her Rock'n Tapestries (and am very anxiously awaiting its sequel Wild Angel: A Rock'n Tapestries Novel) which so very well fulfilled my craving for a great rockstar romance - in many ways went beyond expectations for that kind of subgenre. I saw on her facebook page that this one was up for free on Amazon, and scooped it up.

And then couldn't put it down, and finished it and wanted more. I didn't look away from the screen from the moment I started it until I had read the last word. The frigid winter weather here in the midwest made the tropical setting more appealing than I might normally see a deserted island. The tension of the ruthless uncle and his slave shipping friend are intense, but Gee is a strong, snarky heroine. Despite the odds against her, you never doubt she will find her way out of the messes she winds up in. You find yourself yearning for the freedom she finds in her predicament no matter how much the situation does not appeal to you.

Micah...Micah...the situation sounds somewhere between irritating and horrifying, but she writes him in such a way that you forget all your base instincts and fall for him as quickly as Gianna does. Oh, and the smut! Ms. Copell does smut divinely. But much like my other favorite authors of romantic smut, she weaves it in such a wonderful way that you truly read her stories for their merits as stories well beyond the quick thrill.
