Chapter 69 focused on the landlady’s attempts to turn Kyohei into a “gentleman” by throwing girls and women at him. Needless to say, it failed - Kyohei ended up corrupting all of them (so to speak). It was okay but not my favorite chapter. Chapter 70 starts with the mansion being remodeled and everyone temporarily

moved elsewhere. Sunako and Kyohei end up in...well a dump of a place, but it works for them. The others end up at a hotel. I really liked the bonding between Sunako and Kyohei in this one, they're so adorable and stubborn and perfect for each other!

There was a little bonus story after: *Special Episode: Love Story*. This was actually about the author (and isn't what you're probably thinking). It was cute!
