I recieved a copy of this novel as part of a GoodREads FirstRReads Giveaway.

This was the first book of a trilogy, but this book could stand on its own. There is no real cliffhanger, other than the major antagonist escaping with a promise to attack future generations of the hero.

The authour tries to make this a character driven story. The battle scenes and physical conflicks are are not empasized. They occur, but there is not much details about them. The only fights that are covered in detail are the ones involving the hero. To make it more interesting, the main hero's two closest friends/cousins are potrayed as enemies. This conflict is confusing in its origin and has potential to be very disruptive to the story, but they seem to work together despite it. This could have been used more in the fianl outcome. They came to terms at the end the book.

The story line of a heir to a king being hidden away for his safety until he is ready is a safe story line. The transition he made from a smith's son who had bad dreams to a man leading his peopl in war again supernatural powers is a bit of leap, even with the guidance he recieved.

One thing I would recommend to the author is to have glossary of character, places and creatures. It would have helped a bit in this book.
