On the surface it's a kids' picture book, cute, simple, and sweet, but underneath it's almost poetry; a beautiful platonic love story distilled into a handful of sentences. This book was so very disappointing by contrast. It's nothing but surface, which is fine, but there's no fun story to pull you into either. It doesn't have any of the charm I hoped for. And my son, who is crazy for Gossie and Gertie, and can look at that book alone for hours, couldn't be bothered to listen to or look at this book more than once or twice. I'm glad I picked this up at the library.
